### too bad

• *adjective*: used to describe something that's less than ideal. Shouldn't be used for something very serious. Often used to show sympathy.

A: The movie sold out before we could get tickets. B: That's **too bad** but you can go next weekend.

It's too bad you don't live in New York anymore. I'll be there next week.

A: The restaurant wasn't very good.

B: That's too bad.

#### Synonyms:

• Unfortunate

### high strung

• *adjective*: nervous or easily worried

Surgeons need to be relaxed. They can't be very **high strung**.

It makes me nervous being around someone so high strung.

Q: What was he like?

A: He was nice. But he's very high strung.

#### Synonyms:

• nervous, restless, impatient, on edge
